



Packing List For a British Columbia Hunt

Hunting Gear

- Rifle
- Ammo
- Soft rifle case for charter flight. You will leave the hard case at the hotel in Smithers.
- Large Backpack. We recommend the Seek Outside Precipice and Revolution Frame with a Talon compression panel.
- Rainfly for backpack if it's not waterproof
- Headlamp with spare batteries
- Binoculars (Minimum of 7x and 30mm objective)
- Rangefinder
- Spotting Scope (optional)
- Lens cloth
- Compact hunting/skinning knife like Havalon
- Telescoping Trekking Pole (Leki)
- Lightweight bone saw (Havalon, Gerber Gator or WY Saw)
- Lightweight/compact Leatherman multi-tool (Optional)

Footwear

- Quality Waterproof Mountain Boots like Meindl or Kenetrek
- Boots should be well treated/waxed and have new laces
- Gaiters
- Merino Wool Socks
- Blister Kit (we recommend Compeed pads)
- Sport Shield or Body Glide for feet and inner thighs (optional)
- Muck Boots for Moose/Caribou Hunts
- Lightweight dry bag or garbage bag to put boots in sleeping bag at night
- Stream Crossing Waders (Wiggy's)

Recommended Clothing

- Merino Wool Shirt
- Merino Wool Sweater
- Mid-Weight Merino Wool Bottoms (all hunts)
- Expedition-Weight Merino Wool Bottoms (add to September hunts)
- Hunting Pants
- Insulating Vest
- Insulating Jacket
- Rain Jacket
- Rain Pants
- Merino Wool Beanie
- Ball Cap
- Merino Neck Gaiter
- Cold Weather Glove
- Lightweight Shooting Glove

Sleep System

- Mummy bag, 0-Degree F or warmer with synthetic or 700-900 fill down
- Compression dry sack for sleeping bag (Sea to Summit or Granite Gear)
- Sleeping Pad (Thermarest Neo-Air XTherm or Exped Downmat)
- Thermarest Pillow (optional)
- Stocking cap or headband for sleeping

Personal Items/Misc.

- Passport
- Toiletries
- Medications
- Digital Camera with batteries
- Satellite Phone or InReach (optional)
- Sport Watch
- Sunglasses
